HEAR IT, FEEL IT, LIVE IT, SHARE IT – GOD'S LOVE

Dear siblings in Christ,

I was surprised just recently after worship to learn that a prayer that I have always associated with Luther—"bless us O Lord and these thy gifts which we are about to receive from thy bounty"—is associated with Catholic tradition for many of y'all! It was a fascinating insight, because it's not the first time that the similarities between Catholic and Lutheran worship services have been compared. In fact, a lot of us could easily fit in at a Catholic worship service, following the order of the Mass, with just as much ease and familiarity as we follow our own worship here!

The question that probably comes to mind is "why?" Why do we have such similar styles? Why is that prayer, which Luther himself suggested for families to pray, the same one they pray in Catholic families? Well, it comes down to Luther's main philosophy of church practice: if it ain't broke, don't fix it.

There are only a couple of things needed for our worship service to be *real*: that the gospel is rightly preached, and that the sacraments are rightly administered. Basically, do we experience God's grace in what is being taught, and do we receive God's grace in the bread, wine, and water? Everything else, Luther insisted, is not important enough to argue about. It's peripheral to the gospel. So things like "what form of prayer do we use?" is not central to our identity as Christians. And "do we use organ and piano, or do we use guitar and drums during worship?" doesn't define us as Christian or not.

So why don't we go about changing everything all the time? If the only thing that makes it a Christian worship service is if the gospel is preached and the sacraments are given, then doesn't that mean we can switch everything else up whenever we want? Why do we have to be stuck with sixteenth-century forms? Well, it comes back to the philosophy: "if it ain't broke, don't fix it." If a form of worship works, if it connects us to the gospel, if it expresses who we are and lets us encounter God in our midst, then that's all we need to worry about. And honestly, the sixteenth century forms have worked pretty well! Our hymns, our liturgy, the way we're seated in church, the artwork on the walls—it's all served this congregation well.

But that also doesn't mean we can't change anything. In fact, it's good to switch things up once in a while, as we've been trying this year. We dip our toes into a different worship style not because we're so eager to throw out the old, but to see if this new thing helps more people connect with God in our time together. What music expresses our hope in God? What words and prayers say what we really mean? What declarations in our sacraments open our eyes to God's presence in the bread, the wine, and the water? Newness for the sake of encountering God more fully is good.

It's why I think we should always be interrogating our worship forms, our prayer forms, our ways of being church together. We should always be asking ourselves if *this* way of doing things is still working, if it's still bringing people into God's presence, if it's reminding and pointing us toward the gospel. Because whatever we can do to make that happen is good. And maybe that means keeping things as they are. And maybe it means changing some things to be new. Either way, if God is experienced in it, then Luther would agree that it's good.
