Dear siblings in Christ,

This summer, we've been hearing about the patriarchs, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. These Genesis stories are some of the best known and most readily remembered stories in the Bible for many of us. But the thing that always strikes me is how incredibly honest they are! Here we have the founders of a nation, the paragons who were the first to walk with God, and scripture is full of their mistakes and foibles and sins.

It's so remarkable because most of the time, nations will try to clean up everything about their founders. The origin stories of China have these impossibly wise, impossibly virtuous leaders who bestowed prosperity and stability on the nation. The origin stories of almost every European country has a king (or queen) who is now a saint. In our own history, we tend to dress up the Founding Fathers as paragons of wisdom with impossible foresight to craft a country like no other. And every origin story I have ever read about does the same thing—it works hard to present the first leaders of a nation as ideals that everyone should imitate. But then we have the origin story in Genesis, and the shockingly honest portrayals of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

The Bible doesn't shy away from sharing with us that Abraham lied and cheated and hurt people with his mistakes and misunderstandings. It doesn't back down from the way Isaac and Rebekah chose favorites and put their sons at odds with each other. It doesn't try to mask how nakedly ambitious and deceitful Jacob was, or how his own favoritism caused rifts in his family to the point that one of his sons was sold into slavery by his other sons.

But at the same time, it shows us incredibly faithful people. Abraham keeps trying to follow God, listening to that hope and promise and never letting go of it. Isaac leans on God who orchestrates his meeting with the love of his life, and gives him sons who would carry on his name and his blessing. And Jacob grows into the man who would throw his whole hope on God, wrestling with God through the night to get a blessing.

The thing is, people have always been people. And more than anything, the Bible lets us know that the patriarchs were people, with faithfulness and kindness and loyalty, but also with jealousy and greed and conniving. Ironically, I think that makes them even better role models than our own cleaned-up images of our nation's founders. Because when we set up an ideal, we can never attain it. We can never be as good, or wise, or prescient as those idealized founders. But we can be like Abraham, or Isaac, or Jacob. We can be filled with foibles, but still try to be faithful. We can still make mistakes even as we serve God.

Because at the end of the day, that's the kind of people that God works with. God works with people who are misguided and loyal. God works with people who are faithful and unsure. God works with people who don't get it right, but get up each day and try. God is faithful, and that is so much more important than anything we can do. So let's take the honesty of scripture as God's invitation to be who we are, and not get caught up in the times we fall short of some ideal.



NOTE ON AIR QUALITY: It was reported last year that the filters in the vent above the grill never needed cleaning. After extensive testing we have found that when the fan in the ceiling behind the grill is on, none of the grease filled smoke from the grill exits through the vent above. It is spread throughout the stand. So, our air quality is improved if we keep the ceiling fan off.


