#### HEAR IT, FEEL IT, LIVE IT, SHARE IT - GOD'S LOVE

Dear siblings in Christ,

February is a cold month. I know that seems really obvious to you as you read those words, but it's true! It's cold, and what's more, it's snowy. Again, that seems obvious, right? It would make sense, but it's not snowy everywhere. In fact, it was a huge deal when the South received a blanket of snow last month. I had friends posting on Facebook the pictures of their families getting out and making snowmen, going sledding, having snowball fights—events that are very rare where I grew up. Snow happens maybe once every four or five years.

A lot of our life experiences are like the snow we experience every winter. What we grow up around shapes our idea of what "normal" is. When something happens that isn't "normal," we have a peculiar way of reacting to it. We assume the new thing is the issue, the interloper, the disruptor—rather than looking at our own limited experience of things outside of our "normal." That makes it a real challenge when our "normal" starts to become less, well, "normal."

These past two years have exposed a lot about how we do church together and what needs to change. We've had the signs for a couple decades now, but the pandemic really put the focus on the things we have needed to change. How do we help people connect their own daily lives to the experience of Jesus and his grace? How do we form young people to value that life-giving relationship with God? How do we make worship a central feature of our life together in a way that honors each person's gifts and passions? How do we balance reaching out in new and challenging ways with maintaining the bonds of love we have for one another?

So much of what was "normal" for the church has been slipping away, and that feels scary and intimidating and anxiety-producing. But maybe we should think of it like snow. There are whole groups of people for whom snow in winter is not "normal," but special and unique. They're used to winters without snowplows and shovels. They don't have to put on everything they own before going out the door into the dreadful blast of February. And yet they seem to do fine the way they are.

What other "normals" are out there that we haven't experienced yet, that could make the church better at sharing the love of Jesus? How could we look outside our own experience as a faith community to learn from others, so that we can be better at sharing the gospel in a new world with new patterns? Perhaps this pandemic, by accelerating our need to pay attention to the "normal" that has been slipping away for decades, was just the push we needed to learn a new normal, so that a new generation could come to know and love Jesus like we did.

#### Worship Service Content and Tech Upgrade

We will begin adding more parts of the Worship that was taken out during COVID. The Kyrie and the Hymn of Praise will happen. Possibly communion up front by Easter, if things are better.

#### Funeral Expense Assistance Fund

A family would like to give assistance to families that need help. This would not be to pay for a funeral, but to upgrade, if needed. For example, if a family would like to upgrade their cof-fin choice.

There will be an explanation put into the newsletter. The donating family will talk to some of the local funeral homes.

#### Disposal of 2 balcony pews

We will accept bids during a one-month period from members to bid on the pews. The highest offer will be able to purchase the pews. Information will be put in the February newsletter.

#### Men In Mission Meeting Minutes 1/15/22

After breakfast prepared by Bruce, Brian, and Tim Wiff, devotions were led by Pastor Lucas.

The business meeting was called to order by Pres. Lemoine Baker.

The secretary's report was read and approved.

The treasurer's report from October was amended. We adjusted the money amounts in the three sub-accounts. After a recent deposit of \$200 in the L. P. Bible camp fund, we have \$4047.64 in that fund, \$20,315.18 in the fair stand fund, and \$2855.15 in the general fund. We have received \$1600 from the softball league for last summer.

A motion was made by Brian, seconded by Donna that we forward \$16,300 to the church from the fair stand fund for outreach ministries. This leaves us \$3000 for next year's start up expenses and \$1000 for maintenance issues at the stand. The treasurer's report was approved.

Old Business:

Discussion on the fair stand grill. We have decided that we can continue to use the grill that is there. One of the burners has been welded, but the other three are functioning well.

Discussion on the Oyster Stew/ Soup dinner scheduled for tomorrow. Motion made by Clair and seconded by Bill B. that the profits go into the Luther Point Bible camp fund. We will have oyster stew, chili, vegetable beef soup and chicken/wild rice soup. Containers will be available for those who would rather take-out rather that eat-in.

New Business:

Ball field.

Donna reported that 6 teams are committed to play next summer. We are waiting on a response from 2 more teams. About \$18,000 has been raised for the well/ bathroom at the ball field. The estimated cost is somewhere around \$30,000. \$700 was raise from the candy walk in December. We will need to set up a workday this spring at the ball field.

The next MIM meeting will be Saturday, March 19th at 8:00 a.m. Bill and Donna will serve breakfast.

Motion made by donna, seconded by Bill to adjourn.
