HEAR IT, FEEL IT, LIVE IT, SHARE IT - GOD'S LOVE

Dear siblings in Christ,

Each summer, we have a group of our youth go on a mission trip. In years past it has been to familiar places like Luther Point, or places a full twenty-four-hour bus ride away, like in eastern Virginia. It's an amazing and intense time where they get thrown together with other youth to do something important. But one of my favorite things that I have had the joy to experience on those youth mission trips is how they are regularly asked to point out "God sightings" they have during the day.

If you don't already know, "God sightings" are when you notice God at work. It could be the happy coincidence that really couldn't have been a coincidence. It could be the really powerful conversation you had with a stranger. It could be the sense of calm and accomplishment at the work you've done that day. It could be some moment where you felt God's presence despite it not being obviously different from any other moment. The kids on mission trips will compile these "God sightings" and share them at the end of the day, so everyone can experience where God was at work.

This year, as a congregation, we will be picking up that practice of God sightings as we find ways to deepen our connection to God. It's a wonderful practice, because you can do it any day, any time, with anyone. Just notice. See the ways that goodness shows up randomly in your life. Notice how people cross paths to make the world a better place. Watch how God can awe you with creation's smallest details. I invite you this year to take the time to notice those God sightings.

You could take a few minutes at the end of the day to talk with your family and share your God sightings. You could keep a notebook handy and write down when, where, and what you saw. You could keep a photo-journal where you use your smartphone to capture the moment. Keep some kind of memory of those God sightings.

And then I want us to share them.

And that could look like posting a weekly God sighting on the church's (or your own) Facebook page. It could look like getting on TikTok and telling the world where you saw God that day. It could look like sending a note or an email to the church office so we can keep a record of it. It could look like making a scrapbook of those God sightings that you'll put together at the end of the year.

Whatever it might look like, I really do want you to share your God sightings with the congregation. I want us to all have the chance to celebrate those times we see God, and deepen our faith together as one person's God sighting could kick off another's God sighting. I want us to get in the habit of sharing God sightings, so that we can grow in faith and be able to name God's presence wherever we go.

So start today. Where did you see God today?

Executive Summary, Luther Point Bible Camp 2022

2022 was another great year of growth, re-centering and exploring new avenues of ministry at Luther Point Bible Camp.

Program

We continue to hold programs year-round at Luther Point Bible Camp with the emphasis being on our summer camp programs. This year we welcomed over 500 campers to summer camp at Luther Point Bible Camp along with 20 summer staff members and countless volunteers. While here they learned what it means to be "Created Good."

We also launched our first on-site day camp "Camp Connect." Something we as a camp strive to do is be a resource for our surrounding communities. By offering half day and full day programs we were able to meet a need in our community by providing a safe place for kids to play, learn and grow. We are looking forward to 2023 and continuing to grow and expand this program.

Retreats

One of our main ministries at Luther Point Bible Camp is to provide a space set apart from the hustle and bustle of the world for groups and individuals to come slow down, relax and encounter God. We had 135 group reservations made at Luther Point in 2022 and are on track to meet and surpass that number for 2023.

Facilities

Luther Point Bible Camp always strives to provide the very best facilities we can offer to all our constituents. This year updates were made to the Chapel with replacing the floor and painting the inside. Future updates will include replacing the windows and adding heat to make it suitable for meetings, events, and weddings year-round.

We continued to replace the old fluorescent bulbs around camp with new energy-efficient LED's. It is amazing how many bulbs are around Luther Point (think in the thousands!). A sling-shot range was added for campers to use in 2022. as well as new kayaks given by a generous donor. We are looking at giving new life to our outpost low-ropes course as well as our sporting areas in 2023!

Financial

Luther Point continues to strive to be the very best stewards of the resources given to us. We are poised to end 2022 with a net positive income and continue to pay down our debts. For over 2 years we have had the line of credit with our bank paid off (prior to that it had a balance for over 15 years). We kept our camper registration costs the same even though inflation is hitting us hard with the cost of food, propane, fuel, etc.



Did you know.... *We receive 500+ shares for distribution. *Everyone receives a generous share for each \$25 donation *One person's share may look different from other's share depending (example; one receives a gallon of chocolate milk another gets 2 quarts of buttermilk or one gets English muffins and the next gets a loaf of bread, etc.)

*Sometimes we get some limited bonus items like cases of soda, large bags of frozen items that are too difficult to split up. These items are given out until we run out.

*Any leftover shares go to various local food banks.

*Cash donation breakdown is 10% to Bethel Funds, helping others in our area and other 90% to Ruby's for fleet, maintenance, warehouse, and staff.
