HEAR IT, FEEL IT, LIVE IT, SHARE IT – GOD'S LOVE

Dear siblings in Christ,

This summer we have been taking a closer look at some of the Old Testament readings from Genesis. It's good that we do that from time to time, because we are rooted in God's story as told through God's people. We hear in Genesis about the stories of Abraham and Sarah, Isaac and Rebekah, Jacob, Leah, and Rachel. We read these stories to get a picture of what kind of people God picks to share the good news of salvation with the world.

If you haven't read through Genesis before, this summer may be a good time to do it. It's a lot, I know, but if you take it little bit by little bit, it's a fascinatingly honest book. See, Genesis is the story that tells the origins of the Jewish people. And normally, these kinds of origin stories would be filled with exemplars of ancestry, people who cast a shining light that makes up for all the mistakes of later generations. In other histories, the further back you go the more perfect the ancestors get. Genesis is not that.

Genesis tells us of a family filled with dysfunction. It tells us how Abraham, the first person to follow God and forsake all other gods, was an old man with foibles, with shortcomings, with doubts, with straight-up bad behavior. It tells of Sarah's bitterness poisoning the safety of Hagar and Ishmael. It tells us of Isaac and Rebekah who show naked favoritism to one or the other of their twin boys, basically sealing the fate for their children to come into conflict. It tells of Jacob utterly neglecting one of his two wives, meanwhile showing intense favoritism to Joseph and pulling the other brothers' ire toward the boy.

But it also tells about amazing acts of faith. Abraham left his home and everything he knew because he trusted God. It shows the joy and hope Sarah has in seeing God's faithfulness through Isaac. Eliezer leaned on God to find Isaac a wife, and found God to be faithful in it. Jacob struck a deal with God at Bethel, and asked God to protect him in his travels. Joseph believed God would take care of him even though disaster after disaster struck him.

The story we'll be hearing this summer is from Genesis, and the people in Genesis—our forebears in the faith—remind us that the people of faith are not perfect, and in fact we are simultaneously saints and sinners! It reminds us that God uses imperfect people who will make mistakes, but who try to do the right thing and follow where God leads. In short, God calls real people, not one-dimensional ideals. What a blessing that scripture gives us the example of real people!

So while we try to do the right thing, let's not get caught up in where we fall short too often. Let's acknowledge the ways that we haven't lived up to God's call, and do our best to make it right. But all along, we are called to trust that God will still work in and through us to make the kingdom show up in our midst! And we can trust that because it's what God did through Abraham and Sarah, Isaac and Rebekah, Jacob, Leah, Rachel, and Joseph.

Gathering for Drive-In Worship

Dear siblings in Christ,

We have weathered quite a storm as we sheltered in place to keep one another safe! It has been hard, I know, to keep our distance for the sake of each other's health. We have missed one another, feeling the distance that used to be so short between us, and many of us are hoping for some small respite from this distancing we've been practicing. In conversation with the council, we have made the decision to offer drive-in worship. We have the space to gather in our cars for worship, and we have faithfully discerned that we can gather in this way safely.

The practices and protocols we have put into place as we prepare for this happy reunion are based on the recommendations of the Pierce County Health Department, guidelines from the ELCA on how to safely resume worship, the recommendations of health experts who have shared their wisdom at several synodical Zoom workshops, and the good sense that God gave us all to approach this time with wisdom and love.

Beginning June 21, we will begin holding worship in the church parking lot at 9:00 am on Sundays. To make sure that our actions align with Jesus' commandment to "love one another," we will need to do the following:

This is drive-in worship, so we will be worshipping in our cars together!

Follow the directions from the ushers on where to park so that we can keep a safe distance from each other during worship. Tune in to worship on the radio station 90.5 FM! Studies suggest the virus travels by particles in our breath, and singing has been found to exponentially increase the number of particles and also increase the risk to our neighbor. To keep the risks down, keep windows next to a person singing up so that there is one inch or less of an opening. If no one is sitting next to a window (such as the back seat) then those windows can be fully open while singing.

We are blessed to be able to resume Holy Communion during this time! When you enter the parking lot, someone will be manning a table to hand out communion kits. The kits will have been assembled under sanitary conditions and the person handing them out will have gloves and a mask to minimize contact. Please let them know how many are in your car (cover your mouth to protect them, whether with a mask, cloth, or your hand), and hold onto the elements until communion, when you will receive instructions on how we will receive together.

An offering basket will be in place when you enter the parking lot, so let the person handing out communion know if you would like to drop yours off. To minimize contact, drop your offering into the basket rather than handing it to them.

We will have bulletins available at the same table as the communion elements. The whole service will be printed in the bulletin, so no need to worry about getting a hymnal. Please note that we plan on giving one bulletin for each vehicle. The bulletin will also be available on the website for you to either download onto a device, or print at home and bring to church.

As tempting as it may be to get out and catch up with others, please stay in your car. There is still so much unknown about this virus, but it is known that you can be infectious without having any symptoms. Because of this, we won't have any social gatherings such as coffee hour for the time being. We keep apart to keep each other safe. If we have inclement weather, please still come! Just keep your windows up to stay dry!
