HEAR IT, FEEL IT, LIVE IT, SHARE IT – GOD'S LOVE

Dear siblings in Christ,

One of the most remarkable stories in the Bible, in my opinion, is the story of David and Bathsheba in 2 Samuel 11. It's a terrible event that describes reprehensible behavior, but it also gives us one of the most important lessons that scripture can give us. That lesson is about confession, consequences, and forgiveness.

If you'll remember, the story is about how David's kingdom was once again at war. But unlike in previous campaigns, David was not with his troops. He was, instead, idly wandering the palace in Jerusalem. One evening he spots a beautiful woman, Bathsheba, and decides he has to have her. Now, that's bad enough, but Bathsheba isn't just anyone. She's the wife of one of David's oldest and most loyal followers, Uriah the Hittite. Adding to the betrayal, David also finds out that his little rendezvous was going to result in a child. That's when David tries the awful art of damage control.

First, he calls Uriah back from the war. If he can just get Uriah to go home to Bathsheba for one night, no one would ever know the difference. But Uriah is more loyal to the troops on the front line, and won't go to Bathsheba if his fellow-soldiers can't be with their wives. So David arranges to have Uriah—loyal, noble, upright Uriah—sent too far up in the battle line so he would be killed. All so David wouldn't have to admit his wrong.

But the tale doesn't end there. David's court prophet, Nathan, is given a vision from God and instructions to instruct the king. So Nathan approaches the king, and tells him the story of a man who had a single lamb, and despite raising it and loving it and taking care of it, a rich man who had whole flocks and herds decided to take his lamb and slaughter it for a feast. David's judgment is as swift as it is brutal: the rich man ought to be put to death, and from his estate the poor man would be compensated four times over!

Then Nathan reveals it: "You are the man!"

And that's when the most remarkable thing happens. We are conditioned in our fallen nature to bodily reject the idea that we could ever be the bad guy in the story. When confronted with poor behavior, our first instinct is to justify it, to give all the good reasons we did it, to minimize any of the harm we caused and cast as much blame onto anyone else that we can. We will bend over backwards, even altering our own memories, if it means we don't have to confront the fact that we can be the bad guy. But here, here in scripture, David responds to Nathan's accusation not with equivocating or defending himself, but with confession. "I have sinned against the Lord!" he says.

Confession and forgiveness is our Christian superpower. The ability to say "yes, I was the bad guy, and I am sorry," is uniquely ours to show the world. Jesus saves us from sin, so we don't have to be wed to it, trying to justify it, pretending that we are incapable of wrongdoing. We can name the ways we've been the bad guy, approaching disagreements and arguments with the humility of imagining *we* are in the wrong, and by doing that, we heal the world. When we admit what we've done, then the healing can begin. When we admit we can be wrong, the world will notice and wonder why. And then we can show them Jesus.

We are so very thankful for each and everyone of you who help out throughout the fair, whether it be with soup making, pie making, cleaning the fair stand, being a chairperson for a shift, working a shift or two during the fair and all of our other behind the scenes people, YOU are deeply appreciated!

A special thanks to all who donate to the Hamburger Fund. This goes a long way to help reduce our expenses and thereby increase our revenue given to Outreach Ministries.

The final worker's list from 2024 appears here and will become the initial 2025 workers list. It will be posted in the kitchen. This schedule will be updated as changes are made. If you were unable to work last year, I hope that you are available this year, so your name reappears on this list. EVER PONDER YOUR LEGACY?

Your legacy is how you want to be remembered after your life has passed. There is a book of remembrance in the narthex of our church. In it are the members of Our Savior's who have made the Our Savior's Lutheran Church Endowment Fund (O.S.E.F.) part of their legacy.

The O.S.E.F. was established and approved by the congregation on January 28th, 1996. All bequests and donations to the O.S.E.F. are invested and only the income from the investments are disbursed every year with the congregation's approval at the Annual Meeting. As its preamble states:

WHEREAS Christian Stewardship involves the faithful management of all the gifts that God has given to humankind - the created world, the Gospel, life, time, abilities, money, including accumulated, inherited and appreciated resources, and WHEREAS the Scriptural principle of proportionate giving, the return to the Lord a portion of the gifts God has first given to his beloved children, is both a privilege and an appropriate response in all times and circumstances, and WHEREAS, Christians can give to the work of the church through bequests in wills, assignment of life insurance, charitable gift annuities, charitable remainder and other trusts, assignment of certificates of deposit, and transfers of property (cash, securities, bonds, real estate), and WHEREAS, it is the desire of Our Savior's Lutheran Church to encourage, receive and administer these gifts in a manner consistent with the loyalty and devotion to our Lord as expressed by the donors and in accord with the policies of this congregation.... The O,S,E.F. was established.

The purpose of the O.S.E.F. is to enhance our churches outreach ministry.

This includes educational scholarships, agencies ministering to adults/families in need, grants to ELCA schools, colleges, and seminaries, and grants through the Synod and ELCA for various ministries. (A full listing appears in the O.S.E.F. bylaws.) No income from the fund can be used for budgetary expenses.

Income disbursed follows the guidelines as set forth in the endowment fund bylaws.

This article is intended to inform you as to the purpose of O.S.E.F. and to encourage you to think about your legacy.
