Opening Devotions: Pastor Lucas lead a discussion of God Sightings and Psalms 113.

New Business:

Approve Agenda: Lanette made a motion, seconded by Donna to approve the May 2, 2023 agenda. M/C **Money Counters & Tech Asst: May-**Jill & Ann **June-** Mike & Ron

AED Updates: Both AEDs have new batteries and are running properly. The basement AED will be moved to the ballfield. Child and adult pads are needed soon. Patricia will reorder them.

Swift Current fiber optics installation: The box is on the building near the tech area. We may need new emails for the secretary and pastor. Pastor will look into keeping their emails. We will also look into a landline with them and check into the elevator phone line.

Old Business:

Budgeting for Insurance Premium and Fuel Costs: We will be meeting with a representative from a new insurance company and our current company to see what they offer. **Fuel account:** Money from working at the Cheese Curd Fest and FFA Truck pull. We will see if Chippewa Valley will give a discount for a "Church rate" and check summer fill rates.

Church Directory Update: We are scheduled for Thursday-Saturday, September 21-23, 2023 to have Universal Church Directories take photos. Each family that sits for a photo will receive an 8x10 photo and a directory. On July 19th at 10:30 am, there is a two-hour planning meeting. We will need two volunteers to help.

Credit Based Confirmation Classes: Pastor met with English Lutheran and SVEA to partner up for classes in order to have more pastors to teach classes. All classes will take place at English Lutheran to be a more central location.

Secretary's Report-

Jill made a motion, seconded by Lanette, to approve the April 4, 2023 council meeting minutes as presented by Donna. M/C

Treasurer's Report-

Designated Account \$88,906.23* General Account \$1,464.67 Money Market \$33,360.45 Total: \$123,731.35 *Note: \$48,024.96 of the Designated Account is from fundraising for the ballfield.

It was decided to put in the bulletin the average weekly donations for the prior month, as well as the average needed per week to meet our budget.

Donna made a motion, seconded by Ann, to accept the Treasurer's report as presented by Debbi. M/C

Pastor's report- Pastor Lucas highlighted the special Holy Week services and Affirmation of Baptism service. OSLC church received a Bright Spot Award at the Synod Assembly for our book study the church council took part in and the changes in confirmation classes. Pastor Lucas' full report is on file.

Committee Reports-

Evangelism Committee: On May 6th, 81 lunches were packed to pass out to area farmers. New Member Sunday is coming up.

Stewardship Committee: There are plastic sleeves at each pew to hold the electronic giving cards. Money counters will need to replace them each week.

Property Committee: Very busy. The following either will or has happened: put GFI outlets in the kitchen, stripe the parking lot, paint a wall in the kitchen, put in a new top on the work counter in the kitchen, wax the kitchen and fellowship floors, replace the door latch to the kitchen/dining room, run a separate circuit to the chest freezer. We will hold off painting another section of the church to see how the previous section holds up in the weather. God's Work Our Hands is June 4th. **Lighting Updates:** Around 122 new energy efficient bulbs have been put in. A dusk til dawn light will be put in for the flagpole. \$120 for lights was donated at a coffee hour. We will also get a rebate from the bulbs. **Prayground:** is still in discussion.

Next meeting- Discuss an Outdoor service at the ballfield and invite other congregations.

Conflict Detection- Look at step outside front door. Should there be some striping to show the short step?

Adjourn- Ron made a motion, seconded by Ann, to adjourn at 8:40 pm. M/C

Men In Mission Meeting May 20th, 2023

After Lemoine Baker requested that he retire from the presidency, elections were held for president and vice-president.

Motion made by Clair/Dave Jordahl to elect Mike Rehbein as Men in Mission president. Carried. Motion made by Brian Johnson/Ron Halverson to elect Tim Wiff as vice-president. Carried. We want to thank Lemoine for his many years of faithful service as president of MIM.

The secretary's report was read and approved.

Reporting for treasurer Tom Holdorf, Clair reported that we have \$4477 in the Luther Point Bible Camp Fund, \$4462 in the fairstand fund, and \$2652 in the general fund. Clair reported that we made \$658 at the pancake breakfast. Proceeds were given to the Pierce County food pantry. The treasurer's report was approved.

Old Business:

Clair reported that he had checked with Barry Stockwell following his rental of the cooler for the Stockwell pancake breakfast. Barry said everything worked well. He is sending his \$100 donation to the church.

We have not had a workday yet for the ballpark. We will be doing something there on GOD'S WORK, OUR HANDS Sunday. As I write this, the well digging has been completed. The Country has rolled the field. All foul lines, fences and the playground area have been sprayed. The sorta-potty has been ordered. The church softball league started play on Sunday, May 21st.

New Business:

Donna reported on the ballpark project progress: All needed permits have been obtained. We will be installing electricity to the playground area so it will be more accessible for future events and it will be lit. Several trips have been made to Heartland in Shakopee to get cabinets, microwaves, bathroom fixtures, sinks, tables, etc. Heartland is operated by the Hosanna Churches as a mission to the community. All spray foam has been donated.

Donna mentioned that a member has asked to use the ballpark for a graduation. Currently the rental fee for members is \$50. Motion made by Dpnna/Dave J. that we keep the fee at \$50 for members The fee for nonmembers was tabled. Beer and wine are allowed. No hard liquor.

Clair asked if the MIM would kick off the fair's hamburger fund with a donation of \$500 as they did last year. Motion made by Tim W./ Dave J. that the MIM donate \$500 to the fund. Carried.

MIM will serve coffee on June 18th.

Next MIM meeting is July 15th with Donna and Ron serving.
