## HEAR IT, FEEL IT, LIVE IT, SHARE IT - GOD'S LOVE



Dear siblings in Christ,

A lot of art has been inspired by the things we read in the Bible, including some of the most beautiful pieces of art in the Western world! One of the most recognizable masterpieces is Leonardo da Vinci's *The Last Supper* in Milan. In the mural, da Vinci shows us the intense reaction Jesus's disciples had right after he told them one of them would betray him. If you look it up online, you can see how each individual disciple has a different expression. They range from shocked and confused to angry and worried. What the painting does is invite us into that night of the last supper, and imagine the feelings that swirled around the table the night before Jesus was crucified.

This Lent we will be exploring those feelings for our Wednesday night worship services. Each week, we'll hear from a few of the disciples and their reaction to Jesus's shocking words, and their own doubts and fears of whether they would be the one to betray him. They contemplate their history with him, how they met and what they saw, how they'd grown to trust this man who did miracles, and now was leading them into some unknown chapter of God's redemptive history. What could drive anyone to betray Jesus, and could there be a clue in their own story as a disciple that might mean they're the one?

Each week when we begin the communion liturgy, I speak the words "in the night in which he was betrayed..." This series, I hope, will help us focus on what that phrase means, and how it reveals even more about that meal that Jesus shares with us. Jesus gathered with his closest friends, knowing one of them was going to turn him over to the authorities and ensure he was arrested, tried, and crucified. He did this, and he still broke bread with them. Even with the one who betrayed everything Jesus stood for.

I think that's something important to remember every time we come to the table for the Lord's Supper. Even when we've fallen short, even when we've straight-up betrayed our Lord, we are still invited to the table, to break bread with him. We're still invited to be nourished by his body and forgiven by his blood. This meal that we eat isn't a closed celebration for the perfect. It's a welcoming meal for those that need Jesus most, even when we don't realize it. I hope you'll contemplate that this Lent as we journey to the cross together.



## **Report from Treasurer:**

**Beginning Balance as of January 1, 2021** General Account: \$8,131.71 Designated Acc: \$30,981.07 Money Market: \$74,903.02

## Ending Balance as of December 31, 2021

General Account: \$79.80 Designated Acc: \$33,354.53 Money Market: \$74,008.36

Notes: We made a loan to our general account for \$4,500 to pay for pre-buy fuel. We are no longer taking money from the money market account to pay for Pastor's housing. The church is paying 100% of it. In May or June, we will find out how much Algot Anderson's estate will donate to the church. Bruce P made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report. ## **Report from the Audit Committee:**

Becky J and Audrey S found everything in order. They ask the Council to discuss how long records should be saved and stored. All reports and records will be stored in the record/fire room. Mary H made the motion to accept the Audit report. Ann Y 2<sup>nd</sup>. MC

## **Proposed Budget for 2022**

The proposed budget for 2022 is \$179,021.55.

This includes a 3% increase for Pastor Lucas and the Administrative Assistant position (Patricia). In June, the Council will look at how things are going and possibly propose another 3% increase to keep up with inflation. Notes: In 2021, we had a budget of \$1,500 for Church Repairs. In 2022, we proposed \$10,000. Some repairs will include sealing the parking lot, painting, fixing the concrete by the entry way. The sewer is not in the \$10,000. A motion to accept the proposed budget was made by Rhoda F. Mike A. 2<sup>nd</sup>. MC

## Endowment Committee Report & Dispersal of Funds:

The Endowment Fund had an income of \$1,491.40.

The account balance as of 12/31/2021 was \$139,450.09. This included an incredibly generous gift from the estate of Algot Anderson. We are thankful and grateful for this lasting legacy that will generate additional interest income, and in turn increase the amount available for yearly disbursements. The donation was put in the savings account, but will be put in a fund to generate more interest.

Proposed disbursements for 2022 was \$1,500.

The Council proposed a Recognition Wall for those who donate to the Endowment Fund. Pictures for those who donate \$20,000 or more, and name plates for other donations.

A motion was made by Lanette to accept the report. Patricia 2<sup>nd</sup>. MC

## Dispersal of Fair stand and Lutefisk Supper Funds:

The amount of disbursements is \$21,247.80.

This year was a record income for the Fair stand. \$2,500 of the Disaster Fund/ECON Assistance will go to the Ian Peterson family for their medical needs.

Mike A. made a motion to set aside one-half of OSLC Maintenance Reserved Funds, starting in 2023, to go to the Fair stand maintenance. After further discussion, Mike rescinded his motion.

Rhoda F made a motion to accept the Lutefisk Disbursements. Patricia 2<sup>nd</sup>. MC

## **Nominating Committee:**

Thank you to all those who have served and are serving on a committee. We appreciate your time and talents. A recommendation was made to have the Lutefisk Supper go from co-chairs to a committee, since it is a big undertaking.


