#### HEAR IT, FEEL IT, LIVE IT, SHARE IT - GOD'S LOVE

Dear siblings in Christ,

This month we celebrate a very important person in each of our lives: our mothers. The relationships we have with our mothers are just as varied as they are with our fathers, but I think we can all agree it's good for us to honor our mothers who brought us into the world, fed us from their own body, and will always love us (even if that love is complicated, they love us no matter what). So isn't it interesting that, despite all the similar traits, we don't refer to God as *mother*?

I know if we were all asked, we would affirm that God isn't tied to one gender. God is not a literal man up in the sky. God is Spirit, and Spirit goes beyond the simple male/female identity. But I also feel pretty sure, if I were to start referring to God as "She," consistently, from the altar and pulpit and in all the prayers, we would all get a little...uncomfortable perhaps. And I suspect we don't feel that way when God is called "He." Why is that?

Yes, Jesus refers to God as "Father," but Jesus also refers to himself (who is God, remember) as a mother hen (Luke 13:34). And yes, God is described as a warrior in Exodus, but God is also described as a mother bear (Hosea 13:8), a mother eagle (Deut. 32:11-12), one who is in labor (Isaiah 42:14) and one who gives birth (Deut. 32:18), and as a comforting (Isaiah 66:13), nursing (Isaiah 49:15), and dutifully teaching (Hosea 11:3-4) *mother*, explicitly, throughout the scriptures. Biblically, the Hebrews were apparently unfazed at the idea that God might be feminine. I wonder what we have to learn from that?

How are we limiting our understanding of how God works in the world if we can only ever describe God as "He?" How are we unintentionally turning God into a man in the sky when we shy away from ever calling God "She?" What traits and characteristics are we denying God when we limit God to only ever be "He?" How are we accidentally giving only men the image of the creator (and all the authority that goes with it) when we forget that God made humanity in God's "male *and* female" image? How much better could we serve the people God calls us to serve if we opened our imaginations and let God be more than "He?"

This month, I'd like to invite you to do something challenging. Just for this month, in honor of Mother's Day, purposefully and consciously refer to God as "She." Try out calling God "Mother." Let it be uncomfortable, because most likely, it will be. But please, give it a month, and then look back. See if God has shown you anything new or widened your imagination of what our mission could be. And who knows, maybe you'll experience something you'd never expect with God!
