Dear siblings in Christ,

For the longest time, I would celebrate Thanksgiving dinner with my dad's family in Alabama. His side is a huge Catholic family, and so we would all cram into my Uncle Steve's ranch-style home, spreading out across any room that we could take up to eat the meal. As a result, there wasn't the tradition of going around the table to say what we were thankful for—there wasn't a single table around which we could do that! It's a long way to southern Alabama, and so since Annie and I got married, we've celebrated Thanksgiving with her family—which is much smaller. I love the tradition of naming what we're thankful for, and each year I look forward to that traditional moment during the dinner.

Thankfulness is the theme of this month, but it's something we can practice all the time. God has given us so many good things, from our family and friends to our homes and careers, our kids and our possessions. But especially, we can be thankful for the talents that God has blessed us with. And sometimes, when we use that term, "talents," we get stuck on the idea that the "talent" needs to be something spectacular. Something we could use in a talent show, or practice professionally, or impress others with. But when we talk about "talents," we really just mean something God has given you the ability to do well.

For example, I know God has given me the talent of music. I love to sing and I'm decent at picking up melodies and can even play an okay banjo. It's not professional level to be sure. It's certainly not going to win any awards. But with it, I can praise God. I can further God's kingdom. That's really what we mean by "talents." They're abilities that you have that you can use to help build up God's kingdom in the world. Perhaps your talent is that you have a knack for fixing things. Or maybe it's deft hands that can easily sew a quilt. Or perhaps you have some amazing baking skills. Or maybe it's your ability to make people feel heard. Talents don't have to be mind-blowing. They just have to be useful to God's work! So this Advent, the stewardship committee wants to highlight those talents of yours. But they know that we are all far too modest to put our own name forward, so here's what we want you to do: think about people in the congregation who have some kind of talent that they've contributed toward God's mission in and with us. It can be big; it can be small. But whatever that talent is, they want you to share what you see. Because each of us has talents that God has given us for the good of all, even when we don't realize it. And sometimes, we need someone else to tell us what those talents are and that we are thankful for them!

Because this is the month to be thankful. And when we reach the season of Advent, it's a season of preparing for the Lord by recognizing what gifts we've been given. So celebrate your friends and family and what talents God has blessed them with. Let them know why you're thankful for them, because they might not believe they're worth celebrating! We can be joyful and give glory to God by naming the ways that God has made us capable of so many good things that we can use to serve others. 4-H Donation – Tabled to next meeting.

Light Up the Fair – After much discussion, John made motion to approve having our church fairstand open for the second weekend of this event, Dec. 15 & 16. Lucas seconded the motion. M/C.

Old Business:

Photo Directory – Patricia and Jill Jordahl are working on designing the book. Council preferred the smaller book, vs the $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ we used to get. Those members who were unable to do the photo session, may still submit a photo, or use the one from the 2019 directory, for a \$15 fee. Final date to submit that photo is Oct. 13.

Secretary's Report: Debbi made motion, seconded by Audrey to approve the September 5, 2023 Council Meeting Minutes as printed by Lanette Place, substitute secretary. M/C.

Treasurer's Report: Debbi reported Sept. 30, 2023 balances as follows:

Pastor's Report: Pastor Lucas reported on his pastoral ministry for the month of September, and highlighted the congregational celebrations: Outdoor Worship Extravaganza, GWOH, Confirmation Kickoff, and Directory photos. He's looking forward to upcoming Lutefisk Supper, Bible Distribution for 4YK & 2nd graders, and Reformation Sunday. Donna made motion, seconded by John to approve. M/C

Youth Report: Patricia was very pleased with the attendance and the \$1,135 donations for the pie & ice cream social. Possibly a record. She reported on upcoming October events, especially encouraged by the 20 people to date who have signed up for Feed My Starving Children. Full report is on file. John moved to approve, Debbi seconded, M/C.

Committee Reports:

- <u>Property</u>: Bruce Place, in Tim's absence, gave an update from the insurance company for the church building shingle replacement. Ed Rohl Construction's bid was approved. A check will be issued soon for the bulk of the expense (\$103,189), with 35% (\$56,102) held back until the work is complete. Donna made motion to proceed with this project, seconded by John. M/C. Bruce also reported about the on-going problem with water leaking in the office foyer every time it rains, the recent striping of the parking lot, and the plans to get the outside lights working prior to Lutefisk Supper.
- <u>Stewardship:</u> Lanette updated members with the current emphasis "Care of Creation" involving plastic bag and wrap collection. The recycle bin is getting a lot of use.
- <u>Worship</u>: Donna & Pastor Lucas reviewed the successful Outdoor Worship Extravaganza event, both enthusiastic about doing it again next year, continuing blessing of tractors/trucks, inviting community, serving lunch.

Conflict Detection: Donna recently learned that we need to have the electrical at the ballpark building inspected by the State, since we serve food & it is considered commercial. She is working to get that arranged.

Next Meeting: Since our regular meeting date, Nov. 7, is election day, as well as a couple other conflicts, we are holding the **November meeting on MONDAY, NOV.** 6^{th} .

Adjourn: On motion made by Lanette, seconded by Audrey & carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:55PM

Please put the items in the grocery cart in the back of the church.



OUR SAVIOR'S SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

This is an educational scholarship for the 2024-2025 school term from Our Savior's Lutheran Church via the Endowment Committee. This scholarship application must be received by November 15th, 2023 for the 2024-2025 school year. Students enrolled in a four-year degree college are eligible for a \$400 scholarship award. Students enrolled in a two-year or less post high school program are eligible for a \$200 award. The exact number of awards to be given will be determined later. The student must maintain at least a half-time enrollment status. The check will be issued in October 2024.

Note: Students not selected may reapply the following year. Recipients are not eligible to apply again. If a scholarship recipient should decide not to go on for further schooling, then that student would forfeit their current scholarship. Your college may provide matching funds for church sponsored scholarships.
