Dear siblings in Christ,

In the middle of last month, Bethlehem Lutheran Church outside of Ellsworth closed its doors for the last time. It was an emotional service, and it was very hard for all the people who had called Bethlehem home for so long. It's a lovely little country church, barely more than a sanctuary over a basement fellowship hall. And over the years, the congregation has dwindled. It was time, because the congregation just wasn't sustainable.

And I know, from a certain perspective, that may sound scary. The image of churches closing their doors may make us contemplate if and when that will happen to our own congregation. But this past week, I was on an annual retreat with other rostered leaders of our synod, when the bishop told us about that service. And she said two things that really stuck with me.

First, she described the emotional moment when the council president, at the end of the service, ceremonially handed over the permanent records of the church to the bishop for safekeeping. In those books were the records of lifetimes of service. They were records of baptisms, of families lovingly bringing their children to the waters and into the salvation God has prepared for them. They were records of council minutes, cataloguing the hard decisions the church had to make over the years. They were the marriage records, marking new families; and funeral records, marking the end of each saint's earthly journey. Those records being handed over to the synod for safekeeping reminds us that the lives of the saints are not to be forgotten. We should treasure them always.

And second, I was struck when she said that Bethlehem Lutheran had finished what God intended for it to do. That in those records lay the written witness to the good work God had given to Bethlehem to do. It struck me because I've often said that to the saints I've buried over the years. The phrasing was a reminder that, just like each one of us individually, each church has its lifespan. It can't stick around forever, just as we can't stick around forever. But it does have a job to do, just like each of us. Our congregation has a calling, and when it finishes that calling, we commend it into the hands of Almighty God, just like we would any other saint.

October is such a beautiful month. The trees are changing colors, the corn is drying in the fields, the cover crops are giving their last verdant hurrah before browning for the winter. It's odd, because all of the most beautiful things of fall are also testaments to endings. The leaves on the maples have completed their calling. The corn as it dries has too. Same with the cover crops, and anything else coming to an end so brilliantly. We see the endings that are happening all around us, and we are struck by the immeasurable and completely unnecessary beauty that God gives us this season. It's a reminder that endings, while sad, are also beautiful.

I don't know exactly what I'm aiming to say to y'all with this, except that the tender beauty of all of these endings got me thinking and thankful. All things must come to an end, but when they end in God, they don't need to be so scary, or so sad. And if some calling in your life is coming to an end—a long career, a child graduating and moving out, a loved one needing more help than you can give, a role in the church that you've held for decades. well, you did what God called you to do, right? So entrust that work to God. It's in good hands. I promise.

Kevin confirmed that the entire church building roof would be replaced. The only cost to the church would be \$1000 (the deductible). Once bids are submitted to Bruce, he and Tim will double check with insurance co. as to our costs. New roof installation will likely be 2024.

Lanette made a motion, seconded by Ron, to approve the Aug. 1, 2023 council meeting minutes as presented by Jill. M/C

Donna made motion, seconded by Mark to accept the August, 2023 Treasurer's report as presented by Debbi. M/C

Pastor's report- Pastor Lucas reviewed some of the August highlights, and some upcoming plans. All are detailed in his written report. Motion to accept made by Patricia, seconded by Audrey, M/C.

Youth Report- Patricia provided a printed report detailing events and financials. She also reviewed some plans that are in progress for next year's mission trip.

Committee Reports-

Property: Re-roofing of the bell tower at the north cemetery is complete thanks to a host volunteers who donated labor and materials.

Conflict Detection-

Other – Discussion concerning classes for adults who are interested in Lutheranism. Pastor Lucas indicated that he would be happy to offer such.

Adjourn- at 8:00 PM on motion by Lanette, seconded by Donna and carried.

Men In Mission Meeting - September 16, 2023

Breakfast served by Brian Johnson and Bill Bowen

The meeting called to order by president Mike Rehbein.

The Secretary's report was read and approved.

Speaking for Treasurer Tom Holdorf, Clair reported that we have \$3480 in the Luther point Bible Camp fund, and \$1409 in the General Fund. Clair reported that two days ago he had deposited \$1500 in to the General Fund from the yearly money received from the Softball league so there is presently \$29009 in the General Fund. The Fair Stand fund is in a state of transition since all bills from the fair have been paid but some have not cleared the bank yet. Clair reported that we made \$17,886 at the fair this year. With the about \$4400 that were in the fair stand fund before the fair, when all the checks clear the bank, we will have about \$22,200 in the fund. The treasurer's report was approved.

Old Business:

Donna reported for the ball park improvement project. The outside of the concession stand is done. The wiring, the septic and the well are done. The foam insulation has been donated. There will be a need for extensive landscaping to the north of the stand. One estimate puts it at \$5000 to \$6000. We have paid out \$51,307 and have \$13,391 left in the improvement project account. There are more opportunities to raise money in the future.

Donna reported that we made \$804 at the outdoor worship extravaganza. We made about \$3000 at the concession stand this last summer.

Donna reported that there is a possibility of us adding two more teams next summer. Both St. Mary's and C3 feel they have too many players for one team and would like to form two teams from each church.

Motion was made by Donna/Ron H. to raise the ballpark rent after the improvement is finished to \$75 for members and \$150 for nonmembers. There will also be a \$75/\$150 damage deposit required.

There was discussion on how future concession stand finances will be tracked. Although no motion at this time, it seems that all bills and revenue from the concession stand will be tracked through the Men In Mission General Fund. The MIM will not be responsible for any other fund raising projects.

New Business:

Motion made by Dave J./Bruce P. to give the Frandsen's a gift of \$600 for the mowing of the ballpark. We whole-heartedly thank them for volunteering their service again this last summer.

Donna reported that the Candy Walk will take place on December 9th.

The next MIM meeting will be Saturday, November 11th with David J. and Donna serving.

Coffee hours scheduled for October 22, November 12, and December 10th.

Motion by Clair/Donna to adjourn. 8 members present.



OUR SAVIOR'S SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

This is an educational scholarship for the 2024-2025 school term from Our Savior's Lutheran Church via the Endowment Committee. This scholarship application must be received by November 15th, 2023 for the 2024-2025 school year. Students enrolled in a four-year degree college are eligible for a \$400 scholarship award. Students enrolled in a two-year or less post high school program are eligible for a \$200 award. The exact number of awards to be given will be determined later. The student must maintain at least a half-time enrollment status. The check will be issued in October 2024.

Note: Students not selected may reapply the following year. Recipients are not eligible to apply again. If a scholarship recipient should decide not to go on for further schooling, then that student would forfeit their current scholarship. Your college may provide matching funds for church sponsored scholarships.
