HEAR IT, FEEL IT, LIVE IT, SHARE IT – GOD'S LOVE

Dear siblings in Christ,

Five years ago, there was a lot of anxiety around this time about our lutefisk supper. Y'all remember, it was the height of the pandemic, worship was still being held in the parking lot, masks were everywhere, and we were daily given updates of the progress of the disease as hospital ships parked outside New York and Los Angeles. In our corner of the world, we grappled with the question of how (or even if!) to hold the supper.

It was Tradition that people would begin showing up at 2:00 and sit in the sanctuary, listening to traditional Scandinavian music and perusing the WELCA gift store as they waited for their number to be called. It was Tradition that everyone sat at tables together, interacting and bonding over fish and lefse. It was Tradition, and we'd been doing it that way for almost seventy years! How could we hold the supper if we couldn't even do the basic format we'd always done?

But we adapted, remember? We adapted, and we decided that, even if we couldn't do it like we'd always done it, no global pandemic would stop us from still making our supper happen. So we switched to takeout. And we had people designate their times to come by and get their food. We accepted that things were different, but different didn't mean dead. And then, when it worked out alright, we did it again the next year. And now we've done something new again by setting up a reservation system, making the kitchen way more predictable and the waiters way less stressed. We took this grand tradition that we've had for decades, and we adapted it.

Which, honestly, is about the most Lutheran thing we could do. The Reformation, which we commemorate at the end of this month, was all about changing the way things had always been done. How are we being pushed to revisit God's amazing works in the world? How are we being shaped to share the gospel in a new age? What parts of our traditions are holding us back from living out the gospel in our lives?

October is a good time to ask these questions. It's a month of transitions, where the leaves change color and the weather gets colder, the geese fly south and the days grow shorter, the harvested crops leave bare fields and the cooling air reminds us of the coming winter. We can't keep doing our summer activities in October, but that doesn't mean we can't do anything. It's the same with change in the church. Just because a tradition can't be done the same way anymore doesn't mean we have to give up. Learn a new way! Try something different! In the end, when God's good news is proclaimed, it's a lot less important that we do things the same way we've always done them.

## EVER PONDER YOUR LEGACY?

Your legacy is how you want to be remembered after your life has passed. There is a book of remembrance in the narthex of our church. In it are the members of Our Savior's who have made the Our Savior's Lutheran Church Endowment Fund (O.S.E.F.) part of their legacy.

The O.S.E.F. was established and approved by the congregation on January 28th, 1996. All bequests and donations to the O.S.E.F. are invested and only the income from the investments are disbursed every year with the congregation's approval at the Annual Meeting. As its preamble states:

WHEREAS Christian Stewardship involves the faithful management of all the gifts that God has given to humankind - the created world, the Gospel, life, time, abilities, money, including accumulated, inherited and appreciated resources, and WHEREAS the Scriptural principle of proportionate giving, the return to the Lord a portion of the gifts God has first given to his beloved children, is both a privilege and an appropriate response in all times and circumstances, and WHEREAS, Christians can give to the work of the church through bequests in wills, assignment of life insurance, charitable gift annuities, charitable remainder and other trusts, assignment of certificates of deposit, and transfers of property (cash, securities, bonds, real estate), and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of Our

Savior's Lutheran Church to encourage, receive and administer these gifts in a manner consistent with the loyalty and devotion to our Lord as expressed by the donors and in accord with the policies of this congregation.... The O,S.E.F. was established.

The purpose of the O.S.E.F. is to enhance our churches outreach ministry.

This includes educational scholarships, agencies ministering to adults/families in need, grants to ELCA schools, colleges, and seminaries, and grants through the Synod and ELCA for various ministries.

(A full listing appears in the O.S.E.F. bylaws.) No income from the fund can be used for budgetary expenses.

Income disbursed follows the guidelines as set forth in the endowment fund bylaws.

This article is intended to inform you as to the purpose of O.S.E.F. and to encourage you to think about your legacy.

## OUR SAVIOR'S SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

This is an educational scholarship for the 2026-2027 school term from Our Savior's Lutheran Church via the Endowment Committee. This scholarship application must be received by December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025 for the 2026-27 school year. Students enrolled in a four-year program are eligible for a \$400 scholarship award. Students enrolled in a two-year or less post high school program are eligible for a \$200 award. The exact number of awards to be given will be determined later. The student must maintain at least a half-time enrollment status. The check will be issued in October 2026.

**Note:** Students not selected may reapply the following year. Recipients are not eligible to apply again. If a scholarship recipient decides not to go on for further schooling, that student would forfeit their current scholarship. Your college may provide matching funds for church sponsored scholarships.
