power of God, ⁹who saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works but according to his own purpose and grace. This grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, ¹⁰but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. ¹¹For this gospel I was appointed a herald and an apostle and a teacher, ¹²and for this reason I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know the one in whom I have put my trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that day what I have entrusted to him. ¹³Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. ¹⁴Guard the good treasure entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us.

Lutefisk Supper 2022 The 74th Annual Lutefisk Supper will continue this year but with some major changes. The menu remains basically the same. If you have friends and relatives asking you for information about this year's meal, here are the details.

The supper will be a dine-in meal but we will consider take-out orders reserved ahead. The major change is reservations are needed as found on our website: www.oursaviorschurch.info with a link to "Signup Genius". You do not need to login or set up an account. Just directly click on the time desired. Reservations can also be made by emailing or calling the office with the needed information. Payment can be mailed to the church or paid at the door. No online payment is required. Ticket prices increased for adults to \$20 but youth tickets remained the same at \$12 and \$7. We are limiting the number of reservations to 400 with another 100 volunteers. We are starting later at 2:30 and the last setting is at 6:00 p.m. We ask that reservations be made by Monday, October 17 to help us plan more efficiently.
